The Nominations Committee is seeking candidates for the positions of Vice Chair and Board Member for the 2026 election. The information obtained on this form will be used by the Nominations Committee to assess your candidacy.

DEADLINE

Individuals interested in standing for nomination must complete this form and submit it, along with any supporting materials, in PDF format to the Nominations Committee by February 16, 2026 at 4PM using the upload page on the College website. Applications received or found to be incomplete after this deadline will not be reviewed. Please note that at least one interview by Nominations Committee members is compulsory as part of the nominations process.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR POTENTIAL NOMINEES

Service on the College of Applied Biologist's Board is a significant contribution to the public and the profession. Registrants who make this commitment do so with the understanding that this role's primary function is to serve the public through the dutiful administration of the *Professional Governance Act* and Regulations.

Members of the Board have a fiduciary duty to the College of Applied Biologists and must carry out in good faith the duties prescribed to them through legislation and the College's Bylaws.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES TO THE COLLEGE OF APPLIED BIOLOGISTS

The College and its Board have the duty to uphold and protect the public interest respecting the practice of professional applied biology. As a member of the Board, you also have a number of duties and responsibilities in your role as a Board member. These duties are in addition to the Code of Ethics and Professional Conduct.

Duty of Care: In making decisions, you must act in the best interests of the public. You do not represent a segment of the registrant body. Decisions are to be based upon facts and reliable information and action is not to be taken without first taking care to be properly informed. You must exercise the degree of skill and diligence reasonably expected from an ordinary person having your knowledge and experience.

Duty of Loyalty: You must maintain the confidentiality of information received by you in your capacity as Board Member both before and after completion of your term on the Board and you must avoid situations where you could put yourself in a position of conflict between your own private interests and the best interests of the College of Applied Biologists.

Duty of Compliance: You must carry out the College's duties and objects and take all necessary and reasonable measures to ensure compliance with laws and regulations as well as policies that apply to the College and its Board.

Board Members are expected to adhere to the College's Code of Ethics and Professional Conduct, Board Member expectations and policies and to perform and uphold their duties with objectivity, honesty, and ethically without personal or corporate gain. All Board Members are required to sign an Oath of Office to demonstrate that the requirements of the role and the commitment expected are understood.

ELIGIBILITY

Registered Professional Biologists, Registered Biology Technologists and Applied Biology Technicians in good standing are eligible to stand for election as a Board Member and must meet additional eligibility requirements as described in the Professional Governance General Regulation, College bylaws and Policy 3-100.

Candidates for the office of Vice Chair must also have served on the Board for one (1) year in the last five (5 years or acted as a member of a statutory committee for at least two (2) years in the past five (5) years as of the date of the next annual general meeting. (See also Position Profiles)

TERMS OF OFFICE

The Vice Chair is elected as part of a three-year term where they serve in the first year as Vice Chair, the second year as Chair, and the third year as Past Chair. Board Members may be elected for two- and three-year terms in order to stagger appointments year over year. If applying for the Board, please consider that the term may be up to a three-year commitment: when multiple Board Member positions are available the candidates receiving the most votes for Board Member will be elected to the three-year terms and the candidate with the third-most votes for Board Member will be elected to the two-year term.

Submit a completed copy of this form and any supporting documents in PDF format using the upload tool on the College website. Submissions will be reviewed by Victoria Burdett-Coutts, Chair, Nominations Committee and members of the Nominations Committee.

Applications must be received by February 16, 2026 at 4PM to be considered for candidacy.
