c) Discipline	There are some items that have been removed from previous College Rules, such as term lengths and requirements, because they are contained in the Act – replicating them in By-laws is redundant or even moot	conducted at ANNUAL general meeting	
	Note that requirement for amount of meetings has been revised to state "at least four" from a requirement of five for added flexibility		
	Some of the College Rules had administrative tasks assigned to elected Councillors, but the By-laws have

	Work is ongoing on completing a list of "definitions" to support language used in the By-laws • Will need to define "in-person", especially as it relates to quorum		
	Legal has recommended that Part 4, sec. 3 (the 30-minute clause) be applied to Council meetings as well		
	What remains to determine for By-laws is the Finance division/section and a draft By-law is in progress		
	Derek delivered verbal update on Registration By-law, including discussion on applied biology professionals who fall just short of meeting the College's entry requirements in Streams 3 and 4 • The Credentials chair and Registrar are review possibility of a limited license designation for specific areas of practice		
	Christine delivered verbal update on Discipline By-laws		
	Drafting of discipline and penalties is being done by legal counsel and remains ongoing – it's a couple of weeks behind		
	Council is in agreement with the direction and composition of current Bylaws

	Could be corroborated by reasons for resignation Suggestion that there could be some merit in reviewing how the maternal-centric approach to childcare may have affected employment (ie. respondents who identified as female who also responded that their employment has been affected)		
8) Report on regulated/reserved practice meetings with other regulators	Christine delivered update and discussed current draft definitions of regulated and reserved practice The College, based on feedback from other regulators, has removed the stipulation about academia from its reserved practice and has removed references to education • The Foresters have begun to develop a new designation for professionals who are purely doing teaching and research Conversations are ongoing regarding the merits of including provisions about probono or volunteer work in reserved practice – it may end up being removed from the final definition • The definition was originally included to address instances where professionals give "off-the-cuff" advice in community or charity contexts • The College will not delay implementation of practice rights to litigate inclusion of statements on volunteer work The College has added some context to definition of professional documents so that its clear that this section refers to applied biology documents	College will include in communication the discussions revolving around climate science and order of verbs Policies, legislation and covenants are not specified in the professional documents section and should be added
