Wildlife Biologist - Northeast Region

The Ministry of Water, Land and Resource Stewardship is accountable for integrated land and natural resource management, including objective setting for land and marine environments, effectively managing cumulative effects, and advancing reconciliation with Indigenous peoples, environmental sustainability, and economic growth.

The Wildlife Biologist implements and supports wildlife management. This role leads and/or develops, contributes to programs, projects and initiatives for the management, protection and recovery of species, habitats and ecosystems.

Qualifications for this role include:

- Minimum of a Bachelor's Degree in a related field (biology, wildlife biology, ecology, natural resource management, etc.).
- Minimum four (4) years of wildlife related experience (or an acceptable combination of education and experience), including field-based biological sampling, analysis and reporting, and providing advice within a regulatory regime.
- Registered, or immediately eligible for registration, as a Registered Professional Biologist (RPBio) in BC with the College of Applied Biologists (CAB). Note: immediately eligible for registration is defined as being able to transfer a current membership from an applicable jurisdiction to the CAB within six (6) months of employment. Confirmation of registration/eligibility will be required before an offer of employment can be made.
- Experience assessing and monitoring natural resources.
